AGAHE, in collaboration with Care International Pakistan, successfully organized a ceremony in Village Takia Shah Murad, Union Council Choa Ganj Ali Shah, District Chakwal, to distribute Multipurpose Cash Assistance (MPCA) to 100 flood-affected families. The initiative aimed to support households that suffered the loss of homes, livestock, and crops during the heavy rainfall of July 2025. In addition, AGAHE conducted various sessions on Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) to help communities understand the importance of preparedness, resilience building, and risk mitigation in the face of future disasters. United for Impact: AGAHE and Asia Pacific Humanitarian Fund Supporting Flood-Affected Communities

With the support of the Asia Pacific Humanitarian Fund (APHF), AGAHE provided life-saving assistance to flood-affected communities in Multan and Jhang through the distribution of essential relief items. In Multan, 900 food baskets and 350 NFI/hygiene kits were distributed, reaching a total of 1,250 vulnerable families. In Jhang, 1,400 food baskets were provided to flood-affected households. This collective effort ensured timely food support and dignity for families facing crisis, reinforcing our commitment to recovery, resilience, and hope for a safer tomorrow.

AGAHE and PPAF Support Flood-Affected Communities Through Livestock Health Camp


With the financial support of the Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF), AGAHE successfully organized a series of seven Veterinary Camps, including four in District Bahawalpur and three in District Okara, as part of its ongoing efforts to restore livelihoods in flood-affected areas.

In Bahawalpur, the camps were conducted in Basti Pipli Rajan (Tehsil Ahmad Pur East) and Mouza Sher Garwan (UC Samma Satta, Tehsil Bahawalpur), where a combined total of 797 animals received treatment and vaccination services. These interventions helped safeguard essential livestock assets, sustain milk supply for families, and accelerate livelihood recovery.

Species Breakdown:

Cows: 164 | Buffalos: 67 | Goats: 243 (Mouza Sher Garwan)

AGAHE and PPAF Extend Relief Support to Flood-Affected Families in Bahawalpur

AGAHE, with the financial support of the Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF), carried out a large-scale relief distribution activity in District Bahawalpur, to support families severely affected by recent floods.

A total of 2,000 food packages, 2,000 non-food items, and 2,000 hygiene kits were distributed among the most vulnerable households. The initiative aimed to address immediate food security needs, restore basic household essentials, and promote hygiene and dignity among affected communities.

This effort not only provided short-term relief but also contributed to the early recovery and resilience-building of flood-affected families, ensuring that essential assistance reached those who needed it most.
