From Relief to Resilience: Supporting Flood Survivors in Chakwal and Jhang

AGAHE, in collaboration with CARE International Pakistan, successfully implemented humanitarian assistance activities for flood-affected communities in District Chakwal and Jhang. In Chakwal, Multipurpose Cash Assistance (MPCA) was distributed to 100 vulnerable flood-affected families to help them meet their immediate needs and session on DRR



to 650 male & female. In District Jhang, AGAHE provided comprehensive support through the distribution of dignity kits to 300 women, winterization kits to 300 families, food baskets to 150 households, and feed & fodder to 90 livestock holders to protect livelihoods and livestock during the harsh season. These interventions aimed to restore dignity, enhance food security, and strengthen the resilience of affected communities.



With the support of the Asia Pacific Humanitarian Fund (APHF), AGAHE carried out the assessment, identification, and validation of beneficiaries in the districts of Jhang and Multan to ensure that humanitarian assistance reached the most deserving and vulnerable flood-affected households. As part of this process, community corner meetings were organized to engage local communities, gather feedback, and promote transparency in beneficiary selection. These efforts strengthened trust, accountability, and inclusiveness in the humanitarian response.

Extending Hope with Dignity: AGAHE and WHH Provide Emergency Relief to Flood-Affected Families in Lahore

United for Impact: AGAHE and Asia Pacific Humanitarian Fund Supporting Flood-Affected Communities

With the support of the Asia Pacific Humanitarian Fund (APHF), AGAHE provided life-saving assistance to flood-affected communities in Multan and Jhang through the distribution of essential relief items. In Multan, 971 food baskets and 350 NFI/hygiene kits were distributed, reaching a total of 1,321 vulnerable families. In Jhang, 1,417 food baskets were provided to flood-affected households. This collective effort ensured timely food support and dignity for families facing crisis, reinforcing our commitment to recovery, resilience, and hope for a safer tomorrow.



AGAHE and PPAF Support Flood-Affected Communities Through Livestock Health Camp

With the financial support of the Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF), AGAHE successfully organized a series of Veterinary Camps, and medical camps in District Bahawalpur, Kasur and Okara, as part of its ongoing efforts to restore livelihoods in flood-affected areas.

To address urgent health needs, 17 medical camps were organized and served 5,391 patients (with 1,992 tests recorded), while 15 livestock vaccination camps supported 4,109 large animals and 1,624 small animals to protect productive assets and enable early recovery.



AGAHE and PPAF Extend Relief Support to Flood-Affected Families in Bahawalpur

AGAHE, with the financial support of the Pakistan Poverty Alleviation Fund (PPAF), carried out a large-scale relief distribution activity in District Bahawalpur, to support families severely affected by recent floods.

A total of 2,000 food packages, 2,000 non-food items, and 2,000 hygiene kits were distributed among the most vulnerable households. The initiative aimed to address immediate food security needs, restore basic household essentials, and promote hygiene and dignity among affected communities.

This effort not only provided short-term relief but also contributed to the early recovery and resilience-building of flood-affected families, ensuring that essential assistance reached those who needed it most.
